Certificate Of Advanced Graduate Studies In Educational Leadership Program**

- What?** A 39-credit program for the experienced educational professional who holds a Master's Degree with an emphasis on producing positive change in school settings. Program content includes school organization & finance, learning theories, curriculum design, change & restructuring, professional development, student diversity, technology in educational settings, sociological issues, and action research.
- Why?** Learn new information and skills that serves to increase competence and confidence in teaching and administrative roles. Earn MA administrative licensure as Principal/Assistant Principal or Supervisor/Director (an option, but not a requirement of the program). Earn a credential that enhances opportunities for career advancement and college level teaching. Better prepare yourself to pursue doctoral studies. Be a member of a collaborative cluster of professionals who take all classes together.
- When?** Cluster 2009's first two courses (likely held as a series of Saturday Full-Day classes) will be held in Spring '09. Application deadline is October 31, 2008. If you plan to seek MA Administrative licensure, you are encouraged to take either or both required electives (EDU 770 and/or EDU 786) during the Summer 2008 semester.
